**Provost & Executive Vice President of Academic Affairs, Professor, Department of Psychology, College of Charleston.** Responsible for all undergraduate and graduate programs at the College of Charleston. The College of Charleston, a nationally recognized, liberal arts and sciences university, had approximately 550 tenured or tenure-track faculty, some 300 adjunct or part-time faculty and an overall enrollment of approximately 12,000 students. As a comprehensive liberal arts and sciences university, the college was organized into seven academic schools and included programs at the College of Charleston North Campus and at Grice Marine Laboratory at Fort Johnson. The

deans of these schools, assistant vice presidents, associate provosts, and affiliated staff all reported to the office of the Provost. Accomplishments included:

- Successfully managed an annual academic affairs budget of \$89.9 million;
- Successful fund-raising activities aimed at increasing scholarships and other strategic priorities;
- Increased dean-level engagement in the strategic comprehensive campaign;
- Created new undergraduate and graduate degree programs in African American Studies, Exercise Science, Archeology, Public Administration, Finance and a degree completion program aimed at adult learners, among others;
- Expanded summer school online and distance education offerings;
- Expanded enrollment recruitment efforts to under-represented and first generation students;
- Successfully completed NCATE, SACSCOC (Interim Fifth Year Report), and other accreditation reviews;
- Led the institution in the development of significantly increased collaboration with Clemson University and the possible merger of the College with the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC).

- Created new administrative structure aimed at providing faculty support for enhanced engagement activities across and external to the university;
- Created faculty support programs which resulted in a five-fold increase in the submission of grants for external funding;
- Launched successful \$14 million development campaign for the College of Education which tripled the number of undergraduate scholarships;
- Four new endowed professorships established as part of College of Education development campaign;
- Led the college through reaccreditation by the National Council for Accreditation of Colleges of Teacher Education (NCATE) and Indiana Professional Standards Board (IPSB).

**University of Georgia – Athens, GA**

**Associate Dean, Research and External Affairs (2000 – 2003), College of Education.** Responsibilities associated with this position focused on the overall administrative management of the Office of Research and External Affairs in the College of Education. The Associate Dean represented the college to units within the university, including the

Office of the Vice President for Research, Sponsored Programs and other fiscal-administrative units relevant to grant and contract management and development. Other responsibilities included representing the College of Education to outside funding agencies including the U.S. Department of Education (USDE), the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Accomplishments included:

- Developed college research support office and administered new programs of faculty support aimed increasing external funding success by college faculty.
- External funding in the college increased from \$8.3 to \$17.2 million.
- Developed faculty support programs for engagement and outreach which increased program income from \$474,926 in 2000 to over \$822,298 in 2002.
- Led successful effort to secure the Goizueta Foundation Distinguished Chair of Latino Teacher Education.
- Developed new college communication plan aimed at impacting *U.S. News and World Report* rankings.

**Director, School of Professional Studies (1993 – 2000).** The School of Professional Studies was comprised of five departments. The School included the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders, Department of Counseling and Human Development Services, Department of Educational Psychology, Department of Instructional Technology, and the Department of Special Education. The School was the second largest school within the College and included 69 tenure-track faculty, 51 staff, and had an annual state budget of \$6.5 million. The responsibilities associated with this position included providing administrative oversight of the budget, working with the department chairs and School Advisory Council, representing the School at the College Council and at the University level. Accomplishments included:

- Established the administrative and fiscal infrastructure which combined two independent college divisions into the School of Professional Studies.
- Established a faculty professional development release program aimed at mid-career faculty wishing to establish new teaching and research expertise.
- Developed a staff professional development program.
- Worked with department chairs in successful program reaccreditation reviews by the American Psychological Association (APA), American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), and the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP).

**Chair, Division for the Education of Exceptional Children (1990 – 1993).** Responsibilities in this administrative position included the fiscal management of a Division within the College of Education that included the Departments of Special Education and the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders. The annual budget for the Division for the Education of Exceptional Children was approximately \$2.5 million and supported 19 tenure-track faculty and 14 staff.
