## INITIAL OFFICES ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN BUDGET REDUCTION EXERCISE

The offices below undertake activities that have associated self-supporting, overhead, or service department local accounts but are partially subsidized with state funding. Other sources of revenue for these areas include student fees, other fees, grants, overhead recovery, the sale of tickets and other items, internal charges to other university accounts, foundation funds, etc. These offices were asked to indicate what they would do to mitigate a potential reduction in state funding for the 2015-16 fiscal year and what impact a potential reduction would have. As part of the exercise, they were given a target figure that in most cases totals 50 percent of state funding received. It is important to note that this is an exercise and that no decisions have been made. The information provided by the offices will inform future decisions should the state legislature approve a buget that reduces state funding to public universities.
